Mangaluru: Mangaluru International Airport reaffirmed its commitment to aviation security with the Aviation Security Culture Week celebration that got underway on July 31. The celebration is in sync with directive given by Bureau of Civil Aviation Security (BCAS) to all stakeholders in the aviation industry to reinforce the idea that aviation security is everyone's business. The celebration which consists of a series of activities, underscores the tag line – See It, Say It, Secure It.
